A practical and inspiring book empowering woman to know who they are, celebrate their femininity and step into new spaces. Women were created to lead, and their calling is unmistakeable.


Gordon D. Fee Discovering Biblical Equality: Complementarity without hierarchy.


Priscilla Shirer The Resolution for Women.


